

Municipal Revenue Sharing Declaration of Eligibility



Declaration Results

- Full compliance with all eligibility requirements**
Your municipality will receive its Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant, unless otherwise notified.
- Incomplete declarations or not meeting all eligibility requirements**
There may be a disruption to your Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant payment. Please work to become compliant on all requirements.

Deadline Fast Approaching: Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant

To avoid your municipality's Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant for the 2021-22 year from being withheld, ensure your municipality submits its online Declaration of Eligibility by **January 31** and that your municipality meets all eligibility requirements.

A completed declaration requires a resolution from council confirming the eligibility requirements the municipality meets. The ministry does not require a certified copy of the resolution unless the municipality is contacted for a random audit. Administrators who have not yet submitted the online declaration will want to ensure the Declaration of Eligibility is on the January council meeting agenda for a resolution from council.

The unique link and password for the online Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant Declaration of Eligibility was emailed to each municipality on November 13. If you did not receive the email, email grcompliance@gov.sk.ca requesting the email be re-sent.

Municipalities of Saskatchewan Call for Executive Committee Nominations

Elections for three positions on Municipalities of Saskatchewan's Executive committee are held at the first convention following municipal elections. **Nominations for the three positions - President, Vice-President of Towns, and Vice-President of Villages, Resort Villages, and Northern Municipalities - are now open.**

Those interested in running are required to **submit nomination papers**. Nominees must have their **papers signed by two other elected officials** from any Municipalities of Saskatchewan member municipality in good standing. Nominations must be **submitted 15 days prior** to the election date, with elections scheduled to take place **February 8**.

Universal Broadband Fund

Cost-Shared Grants Coming Soon

Targeted Sector Support (TSS) is a portion of Municipal Revenue Sharing (\$1.5 million per fiscal year) used to encourage inter-community collaboration and good governance in all Saskatchewan municipalities. The funds are used to support projects that help advance the priorities set by the Steering Committee.

The Steering Committee consists of representatives from Municipalities of Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities (SARM), the Saskatchewan Association of Northern Communities (New North), and the Ministry of Government Relations.

The Steering Committee will soon be accepting applications for funding under this program. The application period is expected to run from **January 25** to **March 5**.

Deadlines Approaching

In November, the federal government launched its Universal Broadband Fund. This \$1.75 billion fund will help connect communities to high-speed Internet across the country and includes a [\\$150 million Rapid Response Stream](#) to accelerate shovel-ready projects.

In response to the urgent need for broadband expansion, the intake and selection process for the two project streams are on accelerated deadlines:

- The deadline for the rapid-response stream is **January 15**. Applications are being accepted and reviewed on a rolling basis.
- The deadline for the regular project stream is **February 15**.

70 Road Safety Improvement Projects Approved

A total of 70 road safety improvement projects in 66 communities across Saskatchewan have been approved for grants from the [Provincial Traffic Safety Fund](#).

Projects include speed display signs and other speed reduction initiatives, as well as funding for intersection and crosswalk improvements.

Provincial Traffic Safety Fund grants are awarded twice each year, and applications for new photo speed enforcement (PSE) locations are evaluated once annually. The PSE



Changes to CentralSource Programming
